DJ Pep, of Hillmount Avenue, Heysham, said: "I gave out party poppers and Morecambe rock. It was just pure energy. You have to give it all you've got in 10 minutes and convey a bit of everything, humour, personality and music."

But the modest DJ, who works in a variety of clubs including, Crystal T's, the Carleton Inn and even the Bristish Legion, says he is not interested in the prizes.

He said: "I'm just doing it for a bit of fun. The prize is probably a collection of Des O' Connor records and I've got those already.

"I feel like I'm in the FA Cup final. I'm a small club who is at the bottom of the league playing against the large clubs who play in the super league. In the semifinal I'll be competing against the high profile nightclubs."

Once again he has just 10 minutes to strut his stuff: "I'll give them some free gifts such as Morecambe rock and I'll knock them dead."
